Funeral Director

Funeral Director's Duties:

- Consult with families or friends of the deceased to arrange funeral details
- Direct and supervise work of mortuary staff
- Monitor and manage funeral service operations to ensure efficiency, profitability and compliance with applicable policies, regulations, and laws.

Funeral Director Careers

- Expected growth of 2900 positions between 2016 – 2026 for Funeral Service Workers
- The Median Annual Wage for Funeral Service Managers in May 2017 was \$56,850, according to U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Other Funeral Service Careers

Embalmer: Provides embalming services to funeral homes.

Tissue Recovery Specialist: Work with a team to surgically remove bones, skin, veins, cornea and heart valves from deceased for life saving donations.

Medical Center Specialist: Prepares remains of those who have donated their bodies to medical science or education.

Ceremonialist: Helps the bereaved plan the celebration of the life for the departed.

Crematory Technician: Arranges for cremation of human remains.

Funeral Supply Sales: Provides funeral homes with supplies, including chemicals, caskets, limos and hearses, clothes and instruments.
